

British and Hessians Land on Aquidneck Island -December 1776





Blockade of Ships - goods cannot come in.



People couldn't move off Island

What happened to the Americans?



British and Hessians took over their houses



Wood needed for heating was chopped down



Throughout the war, British often sailed or rowed up inlets and raided coastal regions, burning and destroying supplies, granaries, and terrorizing patriot communities.

It wasn't just Aquidneck Island that suffered

1778 the French joined the Americans. They made a plan to rescue Aquidneck Island. This was called the Rhode Island Campaign



French Fleet Comes into Newport



10,000 Americans came over from Tiverton August 11

Nor'easter Damages Both Fleets, French Withdraw to Boston for Repairs

August 12, 1778 Fierce storm



British 50-gun ship *Renown* rakes the French flagship *Languedoc* at the Battle of Rhode Island, killing 60 and wounding far more. The Frenchman lost masts and her rudder during the severe gale that damaged both fleets.

Lafayette and Nathaniel Greene try to persuade French Commander D'Estaing to stay.




British Prepare for Battle


*British ordered ships destroyed rather than be taken by the enemy. Lark, Cerberus, Orpheus and the Juno

The Lark's 76 barrels of gunpowder exploded and ignited the Wilcox home. Flaming debris landed as far away as three miles."

*British engineer Frederick Mackenzie wrote: "It was a most mortifying sight to us, who were Spectators of this, to see so many fine Frigates destroyed in so short a time, without any loss on the part of the Enemy."




British cut down orchards, Burn American houses to clear sites for battle.





Retreat


- August 26: Americans know that the British fleet is coming and that it would be at least three weeks before the French would arrive.

- Fight again another day.






The Battle Begins August 29, 1778

Starting Points August 28, 1778






Early Morning August 29th














